We are also continuing our quest to become a resource for non-profit boards and organizations, and have recently completed a non-profit board training seminar with a second session coming up on November 6th.

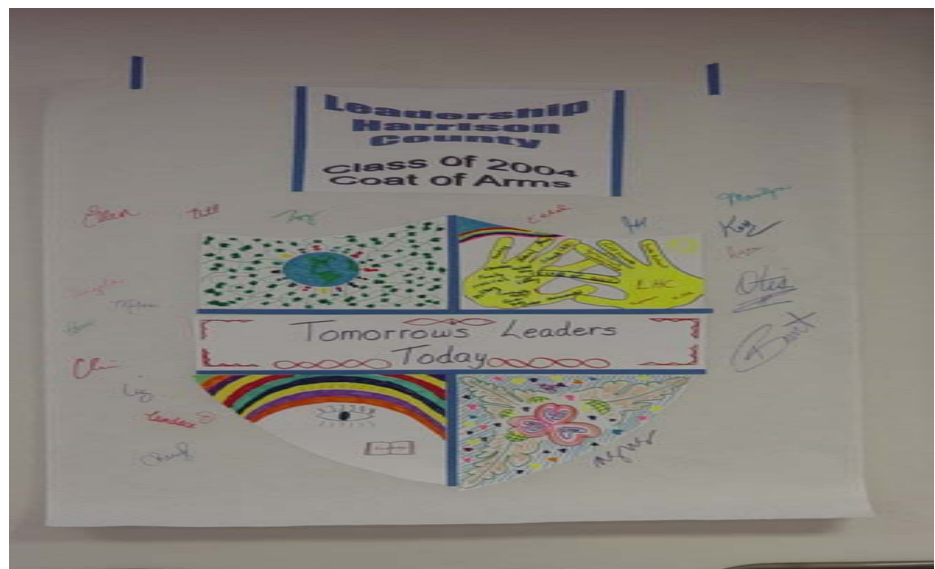
A new addition to this year's class will be

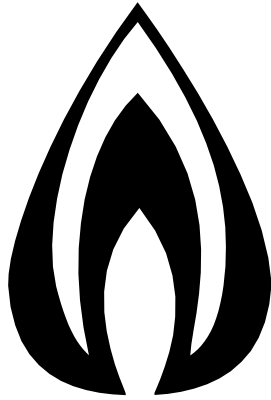
